PRCS Report Update

From Saturday, October 7, 2023, at 06:00 AM

Until Thursday, October 19, 2023, at 14:00

According to PRCS president to declare emergency status and raise the degree of alert and readiness, PRCS is working round the clock with its full humanitarian and physical power since the **thirteen day** in a row and is still responding to accelerations on the ground.

Latest Updates:

- **Despite the threats by Israeli occupation forces to evacuate Al Quds Hospital, still the hospital works on providing its services to the wounded, injured and the displaced as part of its national and humanitarian responsibility.**
- Official authorities announced that they had received about (1,300) reports of missing people under the rubble, including (600) children until reporting period.

Gaza:

Despite the threats by Israeli occupation forces to evacuate Al Quds Hospital, still the hospital works on providing its services to the wounded, injured and the displaced as part of its national and humanitarian responsibility.

West Bank

The total number of cases that PRCS EMS/ Ambulance teams have dealt with in the West Bank since Saturday, October 7, 2023 is (1,545), in addition to (29) martyrs until Thursday 19 October 2023, 14:00. While PRCS crews dealt with (90) injuries during Thursday 19 October 2023, and (4) martyrs. The following table shows further injuries details:

Occupied Jerusalem:

• PRCS's crews in occupied Jerusalem dealt with (110) cases, including (5) martyrs and (105) injury,

Violations against PRCS services:

Gaza Strip: Since the beginning of war and accelerations, (16) violations was recorded against PRCS crews and headquarters resulting the martyrdom of (4) EMS staff, (5) injuries in EMS staff, in addition to (8) ambulances severe damages and severe damages also in PRCS headquarter North of Gaza strip, and damages in PRCS Operations Room.

West Bank: Since the beginning of Israeli military attack on Gaza Strip and declaration of a state of war, the Palestinian Red Crescent Society- PRCS crews have faced many challenges and violations in the West Bank, were reported and resulting (46) violations.

During the day in Tulkarm governorate, Ain Shams camp, the ambulance crews were exposed by the Israeli occupation forces to several incidents of violation against the crews:

1. Arrest of a person injured by live bullets in the head and shoulder from inside the ambulance.
2. Israeli occupation forces are detained the PRCS ambulances in Nour Shams camp, shooting at crews, confiscating their identity cards, and setting a time to recover the martyr and the injured person (the martyr's father).

Occupied Jerusalem: (3) violations were recorded

Displacement of citizens in Gaza Strip:

The number of displaced people in the association's headquarters in Gaza and Khan Yunis is estimated to more than 10000 citizens distributed (main headquarters in Gaza: 7,000 citizens, PRCS branch in Khan Yunis: 3,000 citizens). This increase in number of displaced people comes with increasing Israeli threats, the latest of which was today to evacuate the Sheikh Ajlin area Southwest of Gaza City, which led to the displacement of approximately 2,000 citizens towards Al-Quds Hospital and the PRCS main headquarters.

PRCS Disaster Risk Management Department:

Gaza strip: As a result of Israeli aggression on Gaza strip and threats to target civilians, it was impossible to provide emergency relief services in the field in Gaza and Northern Gaza governorates. Relief services were limited to providing services to the displaced PRCS headquarters (Al Amal City, and Al Noor), its hospitals, and shelter centers, where the Disaster Risk Management Department distributed non-food relief items, with following details:

West Bank and Jerusalem: PRCS’s Disaster Risk Management Department provided relief items for Gaza workers who were deported by the occupation forces from their work places in the occupied territories to the West Bank governorates (Ramallah, Al-Bireh, Tubas, Qalqilya, Nablus, and Jerusalem), where relief items were provided (mattresses, blankets, hygiene kits, kitchen sets, towels) for (405) individuals.

Community Awareness Committees Interventions:

Gaza Strip: PRCS crews (community awareness committees) have dealt since the beginning of war and accelerations with the following:

Psycho- social Department Interventions:

Gaza strip: Psychological intervention teams continue to provide psychological first aid- PFA to ambulance teams working in current events, providing the service to (2,085) beneficiaries.

West Bank: PRCS’s Psycho-social and Mental Health Department provided its services to “Gaza workers who were deported by the occupation forces to the West Bank governorates,” where their number reached (1,720) beneficiaries in shelter centers. In addition to a daily sponsored guidance publication on social media pages, where the number of beneficiaries reached (59,151) through:

- Publishing awareness messages
- Psychological first aid- PFA
- Psychosocial support in times of war and crises.
- Providing assistive tools through the Rehabilitation Department
- Daily guidance posts on social media
