Humanitarian Response

April 2025



In a moment of global solidarity, Red Cross and Red Crescent societies around the world held a moment of silence to honour the humanitarian workers killed in 2025 while performing their humanitarian duty. In parallel, the Palestine Red Crescent Society organized unified solidarity vigils in all its branches in Palestine and across the diaspora, in honour of the eight medics killed by the Israeli occupation on March 23 in Rafah. The message of these demonstrations was clear: protecting medics is a duty, targeting them is an unforgettable crime, and there must be an independent international investigation committee to hold the perpetrators accountable.

Emergency Medical Services

- The teams evacuated (351) martyrs.
- They provided first aid services to approximately (5,704) cases, including injuries from shelling and emergency medical conditions.
- The teams assisted in the medical evacuation of (19) patients and injured in addition to (18) companions for specialized treatment abroad.



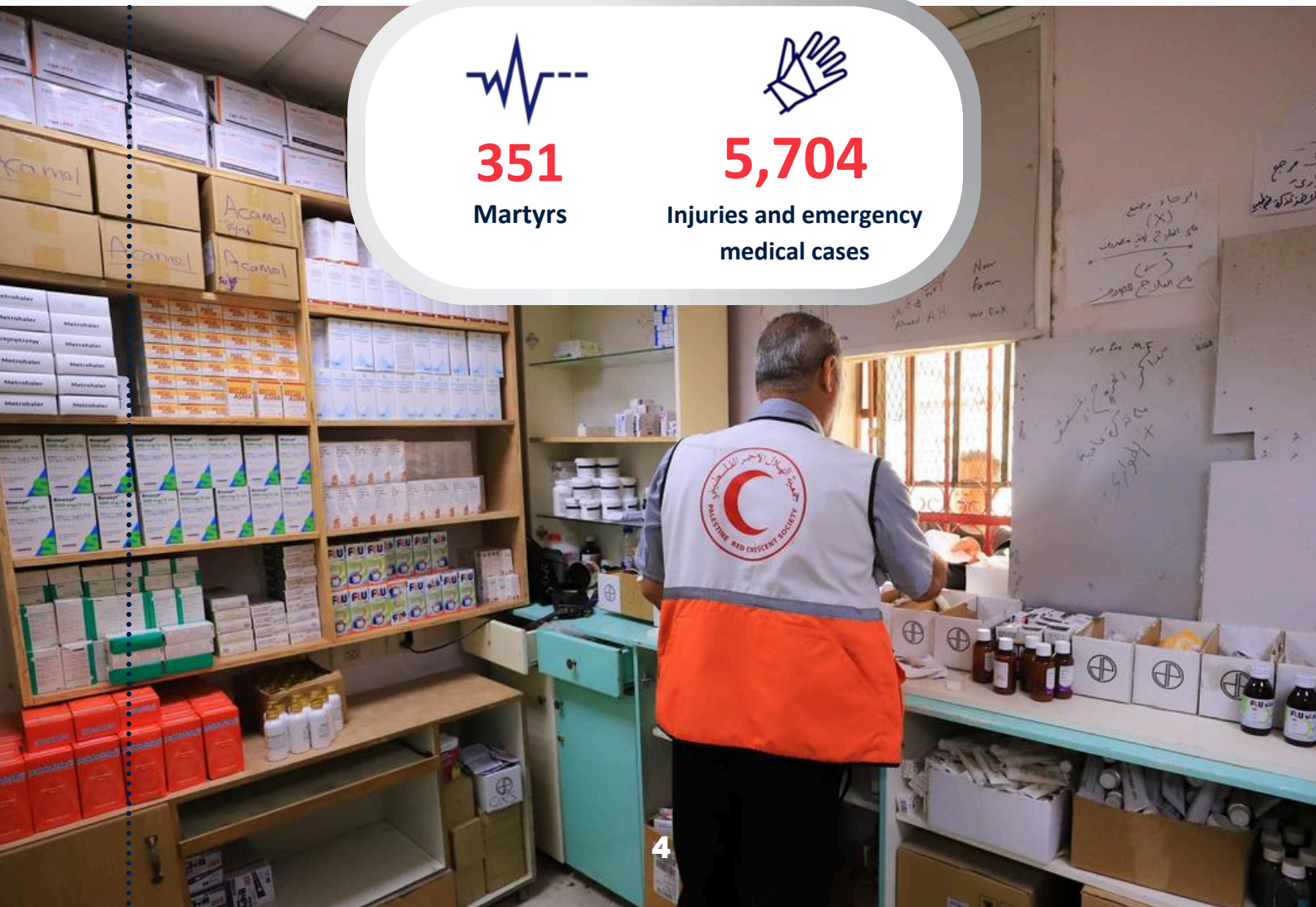

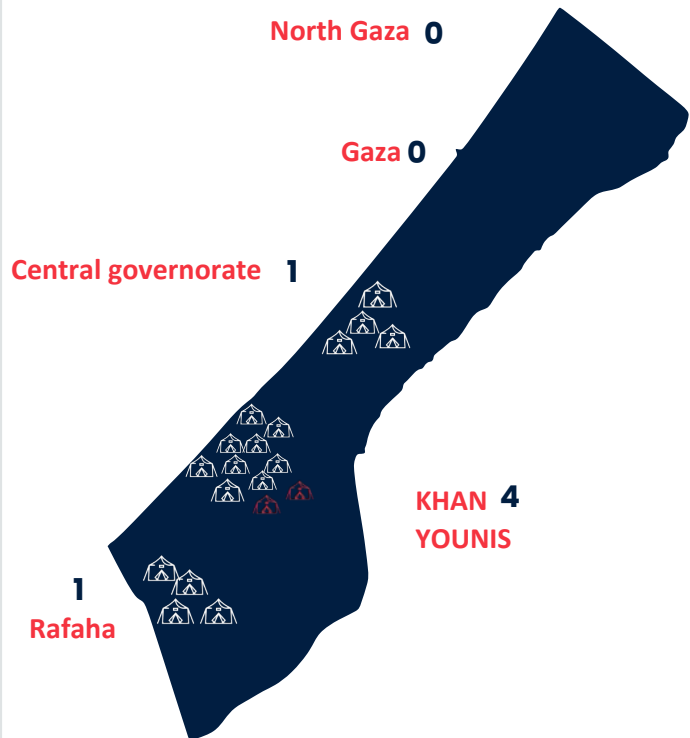
Shelters

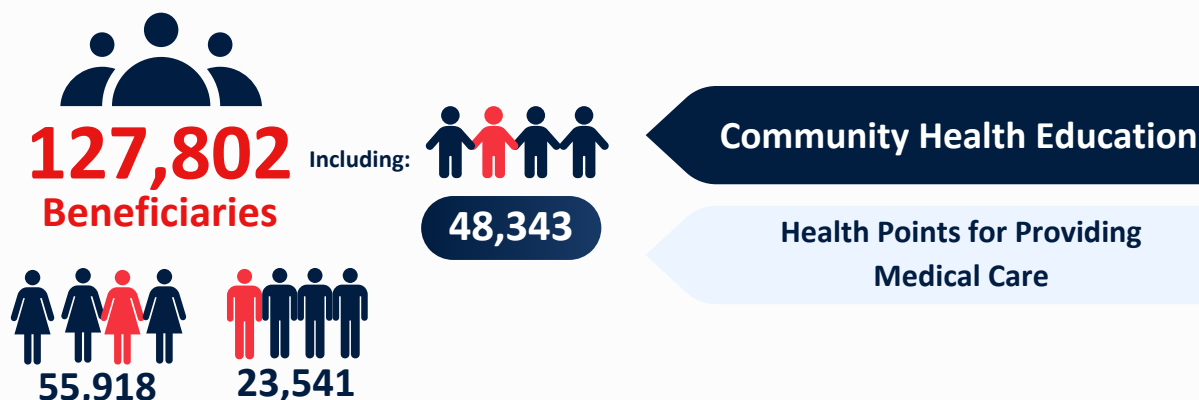

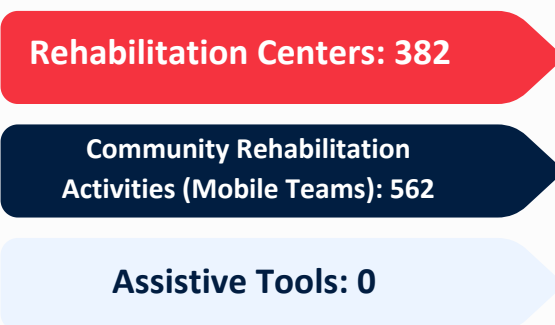
● Enhancing Community Resilience

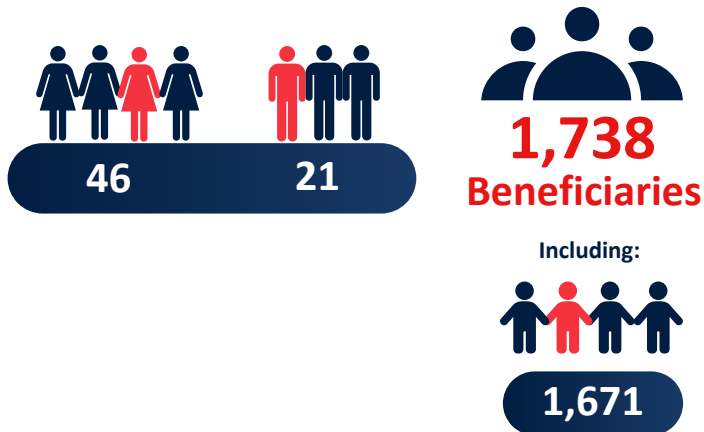

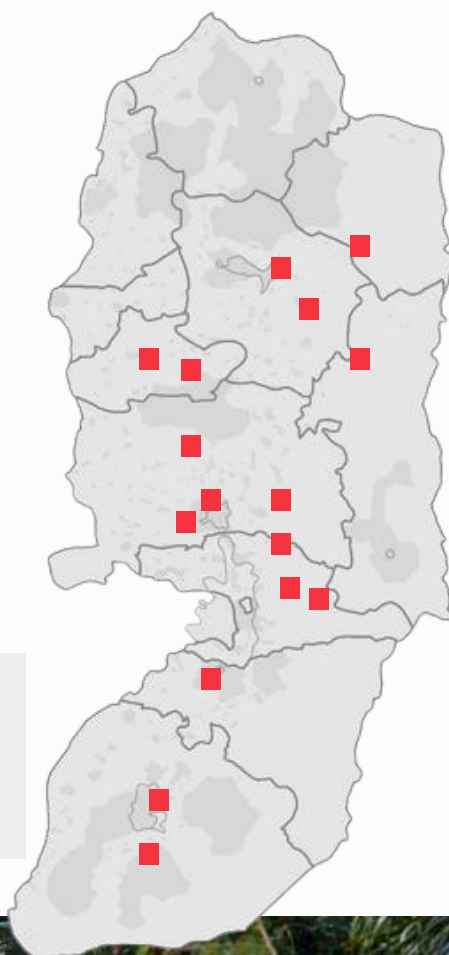
